Signs of Dyslexia in Kindergarten

Struggle with learning even simple rhymes
Difficulty learning letter names and sounds
Confuses letters that look similar (b , d , p , q) and letters that have similar sounds (d & t , b & p , f & v).
Has trouble hearing the individual sounds in words and/or blending sounds to make a word.
Difficulty with phonics
Inconsistent memory for words
Can't remember lists (days, months)
Mispronounces words
Distracted by background noise
Difficulty telling left from right
Poor retrieval of names for colours, objects
Have trouble following simple two- step directions
Does not spell phonetically
Spending an unusually long time completing tasks that involve reading or writing
Avoiding activities that involve reading

Signs of Dyslexia in Grade One

Reading well below the expected level for age
lacksquare Problems processing and understanding what he or she hears
☐ Reverses letter sequences (soiled/solid, left/felt)
lacksquare Difficulty finding the right word or forming answers to questions
lacksquare Problems remembering the sequence of things
☐ Difficulty learning new vocabulary
lacksquare Over-reliance on context and guessing to decode words
☐ Difficulty seeing (and occasionally hearing) similarities and differences in letters and words
$oldsymbol{\square}$ Inability to sound out the pronunciation of an unfamiliar word (problems with Phonic decoding)
☐ Difficulty spelling
\square Symbol confusion (e.g. arithmetic symbols: =, +, -, x,)
☐ Difficulty learning cursive writing
lacksquare Spending an unusually long time completing tasks that involve reading or writing
☐ Dislike and avoidance of writing and reading
